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EMPOWERING THE CHURCH TO GIVE

Author's Note: This book is not designed to give the reader all of the answers, but only to provide the reader a number of key areas to think through, pray through, and work through with their church team when facing the critical challenges in desiring to empower the church to give more faithfully, more sacrificially, and more generously to the work of Christ in the world.

Someone Has To Take Responsibility

A lot of church leaders either run from the topic of church finances, or just complain about how their church does not have any finances to talk about. Whether or not your church has ample financial resources you still have a big mission from God that requires financial and physical resources.

One pastor once asked me "Craig, why are we even talking about this. My church doesn't have enough money worth warranting a discussion like this?" Another guy right after that said to me, "Craig, if I try talking about money or tithing to my church they will probably get rid of me." Those statements are unfortunate but represent the honest perspective of many church leaders today.

For many pastors, church leaders, church members and church attendees the idea of having to talk about tithing, giving, or even church finances in general is a struggle. And to be completely honest with you, I wish it were a non-issue that I never had to talk about either, but it's not. Empowering the church to become generous biblical givers in all areas of life is not just an issue related to the church's bottom line but it is an issue related to discipleship and the spiritual growth of every believer.

Just think about it. As the pastor, the under-shepherd, God has asked you to be the spiritual leader of the church helping people to know and understand the whole council of God's Word and how to live out it's spiritual principles in their daily lives. Now if that is not reason enough for us as leaders to effectively teach the church about honoring God with their tithes and offerings then maybe this can serve as an additional encouragement for us. It takes money to pay the bills! Everyone loves showing up on the weekend to a worship service in a building that is cool in the summer and warm in the winter. They like



receiving a nice worship guide that tells them about all of the upcoming activities of the church, and when needed, visiting a clean bathroom that

is well stocked. Throw into the mix a safe, clean, and well equipped children's ministry and the countless other things found at any functioning local church and you quickly realize that it takes a considerable amount of money just to keep the building up and running and the basics of ministry moving forward. As leaders do we even have a choice but to teach, encourage, and empower our members and attendees to become generous givers? If not for their own spiritual discipline then for the sake of keeping God's church open, functional, and on mission. The issue of giving within the local church is critically important.

My goal in this short writing is to give you a number of areas to think, pray, and work through if for whatever reason you find yourself in a place where ministry to a hurting and broken world is being hindered because of a lack or low supply of financial resources to get the job done. Remember this is God's church and this is His mission and we are His pastors and leaders that He has called to lead His church. It is our responsibility as Pastors and leaders to ensure that the mission of God is being accomplished by the church and His people. So, with that in mind let's take the next few pages to lay out some key areas that should be considered when seeking to better empower the church to accomplish its mission.

VISION CASTING & EXECUTION IN THE WEEKEND WORSHIP SERVICES

Question:

"Why do so many churches make it so hard to give at the weekend worship service?"

In a significant number of the worship services that I attend as I visit churches I am continuously amazed at how in-service giving is an afterthought and negative reflection on the church and it's leadership. Many church leaders approach the in service giving time with such a lack of intentionality that all to often the offering has been taken up and many of the people in the worship center did not even have a real opportunity to give. Let me give you three words to think about when preparing for the offering time during your worship service - COMMUNICATION, VISION, and EXECUTION.

First, let's talk about communication. Just think about it this way. Those leading the worship service know what is next on the agenda for the day but most of the people sitting in the worship center do not know or perhaps do not remember what is coming next. It does not

matter how long your people have been attending church or how long your service format has been the same people still forget consistently. No one likes to be the person that the usher is standing in front of holding the offering basket staring at them while they get their offering together. So what happens in most cases? The person passes the basket on by with the thought that they will give later. You know what that means right? The odds now are that they will not remember to give that week and probably will not make up their missed offering next week. There are lots of ways to avoid most situations like this. You can build in a time earlier in the service where you prompt people that there will be a time to turn in their communication cards and their tithes and offering later in the service and if they would like they can go ahead and get those items prepared. You can give people a heads up that the offering is going to be after the next song. You can give an offering message before the ushers take up the offering in order to give people time to prepare to give. There are literally dozens of things you can do to effectively communicate when and how to give in your weekly worship service. Find a simple and effective way to clearly communicate with your people. Give them the best chance to follow God in giving.

Second, let's talk vision. When I talk about casting vision when it comes to the offering I am not talking about getting up and telling people that you need their money in order to pay the bills or to make budget. While that is true, other than the accountant in the audience no one really cares about that. Inside each of us is a desire to make a difference in our world, to leave a legacy, to see lives changed, to know that what we have been a part of for all of these years has not been for naught. Our people do not give because of numbers that are on the pages of our budgets but they give for the people and that are represented by those budget numbers. Cast communities vision for what God has done and for what He is doing in the lives of the people of your church and in your community. Connect the dots for them, help them to see that the \$100 given last month purchased supplies for the community outreach event that took place last week and then introduce them to the family that came to know Christ because of their faithfulness. Most people can not connect the dots for themselves and that is why they need you and I to do it for them. Cast vision, tell a story, show a video and help their giving come to life.

Third, let's talk execution. The first two are easy fixes and I wish I could say the same for this one but if all of my years as a pastor has convinced me of anything it would be that the people taking up the offering week end and week out must be convinced that it is one of the most difficult things to do in all of the world. Now, I personally may not believe that but the execution in taking up the offering in most services is atrocious. And when the execution is atrocious then the giving reflects it. Can I vent for just a minute? How hard is it to be ready to hold a basket, walk up to the front of the stage on cue, and then pass the basket up and down your designated seating area. Over the years there have been a number of times when our family has been visiting a church and when the offering time came my wife and I had our communication cards and

offering ready to give to only have the usher goof up and miss our row. Execution must be a constant focus of your teams attention if you want to make sure that you are getting it right more times than not.

Poor vision casting, poor communication, and poor execution when dealing with the churches offering time is in my book one of the biggest problems when it comes to giving in most churches. I am convinced that people love the church and want to support it. Why else would they show up every week? However, I believe that they are often prevented from doing just that because of the way we go about handling that sacred time - the offering.

NEW BELIEVER ASSIMILATION INTO THE CHURCH

Assimilating new believers into the life and body of the church is a large component of any church's discipleship process. God never intended for Christians to do life alone but to do life in community with other like-minded believers. As a part of being in community together God uses this biblical structure to fund the house of worship and its mission and ministry as it is being carried out in community within the church and for the community at large and around the world.

Effectively discipling people with the principles and teaching of God's word will naturally include the teaching and tools needed to grow the individual into a cheerful and generous giver. Several years ago, a long time pastor really helped me with this concept. He said, "When God gives you a vision and a plan for leading your church, all of the resources needed to fund and equip that vision and plan lies with the people that are currently in the church and those that you will reach through that vision and plan that God has given you." Are new believers and existing believers within the church getting the teaching and the tools needed to effectively grow in this area of their spiritual lives?

DEVELOP NEW HIGH CAPACITY GIVERS

In every church there are a handful of individuals and couples that faithfully honor God with their tithes and offerings but are left with a desire and means to do more. I have found that high capacity givers like these individuals often go without contributing more to God's mission simply because they are unsure about when or how to best go about doing that. At one time I use to think, "That doesn't make sense. Why don't high capacity givers just write a bigger offering check when they give if they want to do more?" Well, it is not that simple when you are the one writing the larger check.

Many high capacity givers do not function the same way the rest of us do. Many of them will faithfully give their regular tithes and offerings but will not "write a bigger check" because they often feel the need to give to something specific. It could be a vision for a new ministry or a new campus, it could be a physical need for a certain family or people group. It could be an equipment or facility need. Honestly, it could be almost anything as long as it connects with either the cognitive, relational, or emotional makeup of the giver. Typically an individual that has accumulated any type wealth in life normally has done so because of intentionality and hard work. Don't believe for one minute that they are going to just begin writing you random checks of large amounts, \$5,000 or more, without having some idea that you have a plan from God as a leader and know how to implement that plan. So, before you ask, do your homework. If they are attending your church, they already believe in you and in the ministry of the church. Now you



just have to give them a good reason to respond to that desire they have to contribute more. As leaders of God's mission we need to hear from God concerning His plan and direction and then cast vision for that to the church as a whole and then to the people that God has intended to help make that plan and direction come to pass.

Don't ever sell the mission short. If God has given you the direction and the plan then God is already speaking to those that will help fund that direction and plan. Trust Him!

SPECIAL OFFERINGS AND CAMPAIGN EMPHASES IMPACT BUDGET GIVING

Does the average church member or church attendee understand the difference between giving their tithe and giving to a special offering? Do they really understand that designated offerings, special event offerings and campaign giving do not directly impact the day to day budget and ministry of the church? Do they realize that giving to a special offering or giving to a campaign does not take the place of the biblical tithe but is to be considered giving above and beyond the biblical tithe?

STAFF & KEY LEADER GIVING

When I think of staff and key leader giving I often think of the trickle down effect. If for some strange reason our church has a staff member or a key leader that is not actively giving to the ministry of the church then in most cases you can almost guarantee that a large number of people that those individuals lead are demonstrating an even lesser commitment to the ministry. Why is this? Simply put, it is not common

for followers to demonstrate more commitment and sacrifice to an organization than those that are leading them in that organization. If you have a staff member or key leader that is unfaithful in their giving then more than likely there are other areas that they are unfaithful in as well. In most cases commitment and sacrifice for an organization increase as a person becomes deeper involved in that organization. For this reason if you find yourself leading staff or ministry leaders that do not demonstrate an active and sacrificial giving commitment to the ministry of the church it just might be time to think about replacing them with someone who will be fully committed to the church and its ministry. This is not a simple money issue but this is a discipleship and leadership issue that is influencing mature believers, new believers, nominal believers, and non-believers in your ministry in a negative way. And as the pastor you will have to address this unhealthy issue sooner than later if you desire a healthy spiritual environment to permeate throughout the church.

INDIVIDUAL & PASTORAL GIVING REPORTS

Now most churches do a pretty good job of making sure that they provide copies of individual giving records for contributors at least once a year. This is helped by the fact that the government requires organizations to make them available. While providing contribution reports once a year is good, I would like to suggest the idea that you send these contribution reports out to your congregation at least twice a year, and in some cases even quarterly. Consider sending the contribution reports in conjunction with a vision casting letter sharing how lives are being changed and transformed by the gospel and what God has revealed to the leadership of the church for the next leg of the churches journey. This will help remind members and attendees where they are in their faithfulness to giving and provide meaning to them for why they are giving.

In addition to the individual contribution reports I also suggest that, as lead pastor, you receive a church wide giving report broken-down by families at least twice a year. If you are having trouble with staff giving or key leader giving it might be helpful if you received a quarterly report for them specifically until they became more committed in their giving and obedience to the Lord. These pastoral reports are no

different than baptism reports, professions of faith reports, or even discipleship track involvement reports – they all provide valuable information about the spiritual decisions that individuals and families in your church are making. It is good leadership, good shepherding, and good stewardship for you to know the health of your congregation in this area of spiritual growth.

INCREASE UNDERSTANDING ABOUT TOOLS FOR GIVING

I think most pastors would be surprised at what members and attendees of the church actually remember about what tools for ministry and giving are available to them. It's like vision casting, just when you think that you have told the congregation too much, or too many times about something you probably are just starting to get through to them. The same thing can be said about giving tools for the church and just about everything else that you communicate to people in a corporate setting.



Think about this for a minute, if you were to walk up to an average member of your church and ask them about the giving tools that your ministry offers i.e.: web based giving, mobile giving via text messaging or apps, in service envelope giving, kiosk giving, postage paid mail giving, crowd platform giving, stock giving, or even estate giving, how many do you think would have a working knowledge of these tools and know how to help others access them? In most church settings the average middle aged and older members are connected to an in service offering. The younger generation primarily is connected more to an online platform or app giving platform. However, outside of these two basic achievements, I think the number of other tools available to people when it comes to giving is foreign to a large part of the individuals that make up our congregations. Most people primary know only what they prefer, which then means the trick for us as

leaders is to educate, equip, and encourage them so that they can help take ownership for informing others around them as to what ministry tools are available through our local churches. Your church-wide giving will be directly impacted in a positive way with the simple idea of creating greater awareness and understanding within your congregation when it comes to what giving tools are available and how to use them.

ANNUAL BUDGETING PROCESS

This one is for all of those leaders out there that think too much transparency is a bad thing. A secret budget or budgeting process, an overtly complex budget or budgeting process, or a poorly constructed budget or budgeting process are all good reasons for members and attendees of your church to be unsure about you as a leader and therefore cautious in their giving. When people are unsure about something they are not committed to it and they will not give to support it.

One of the first churches that I pastored was a rural church in Louisiana. At that little country church it was understood that only the treasurer could know the actual details of the budget. Believe it or not even I as pastor never really knew what the detailed church budget looked like, or even how the "Finance Committee" came up with it. In that church, it was highly discouraged for leadership to talk about money and the detailed reports that the treasurer and the finance committee provided the church consisted of about seven sentences with some generic totals at the end. Sounds crazy doesn't it? I learned some valuable ministry and leadership lessons in the time that I pastored that church. One of those valuable lessons was that the way the church and its longtime leadership decides to handle the budget can build or destroy confidence in the church leadership. Let your budget and the budgeting process be something that builds excitement, empowers members to be faithful, casts vision, and motivates people to want to give sacrificially to the work of God in and through His local church.

THE BUDGET CATCH UP SUNDAY

This next idea is not one of my favorites, simply because I favor more long-term solutions. I have seen several churches be very effective in having an official Budget Catch Up Sunday. In rare cases where they were having an ongoing issue with making budget I have even seen once a quarter Budge Catch Up Sunday until the church was back on track with its giving. This is dangerous for a number of reasons, one of which is it builds a natural opt out for the members when it comes to giving. Some may ponder, "Why do I need to give faithfully, others will make up the difference on catch up Sunday and the church will make up its financial shortfall." If I were going to do a Budget Catch Up Sunday the I would include a "Why We Give" insert in the worship guide and begin taking the opportunity to explain what it means to give during the offering time in the weekend worship services. I would use it as a one-time solution and quickly begin working my congregation toward long-term solutions for our financial struggles.

RE-CENTERING THE SALTSHAKER

Every so often you need to re-center the saltshaker on key thinking components within the church. Re-centering the saltshaker is an opportunity to strategically realign people with the biblical principles of generosity and how God uses our generosity to impact people's lives and change the world around us. One easy way of doing this is by going off the normal preaching and teaching plan within the church and having a special spiritual growth campaign on generosity. I am sure that you are already preaching and teaching on giving at least two or three times a year but this would be a special church-wide spiritual growth campaign where you would have the opportunity to lead every age group within the church through a true biblical understanding of what it means to be living a generous life. You could even provide daily e-devotionals, written by the staff, for everyone on generosity (be sure to get a commitment to complete the devotionals during campaign). What if your children's ministry, youth ministry, small group ministry, and worship services all focused on growing spiritually around one BIG IDEA: Generosity. That just might be church changing!

If a whole campaign is not right for you then maybe something a little more low-key would help you re-center the saltshaker when it comes to generosity in your church. You could always send a letter to the active church database about giving and the state of the church financially. Then after sending out the letter, teach a series on the mission of the church, casting vision and challenging people to help make the mission possible through their serving and giving.

Whatever the case, never be afraid of being direct with the members and attendees of the church about its financial state and how they impact it. It is their church and they have asked you to lead it. If there is a problem they expect you to lead them and empower them with a determined solution. And if all else fails and neither of the other two solutions prove viable then at least seek to teach one special stewardship sermon at some point in the coming weeks. Maybe even give away a free book on giving or stewardship to the whole congregation at the end of the service. Whatever it takes is what you must do. The mission of the church depends on it.

PROMOTE A 90 DAY TITHE CHALLENGE

Sometimes pastors say, "My people are just not committed to faithfully giving." Well, it is not the fact that they are not committed because a non-commitment is a commitment. Your people just might be currently committed to the idea of not giving vs giving. You might be thinking

that I am just trying to be cute but I am not. I honestly believe that what we think about where our people are impacts the decisions that we make as leaders about how to move them forward in their faith. If I say they are not committed to giving then in my



mind it's like saying that we have already had the conversation on giving and they have openly declared that they will not give. And since I know that a lot pastors and leaders avoid those types of conversations I like to think that there have not been many Christ

followers out there that have openly told their pastor defiantly that they will not give.

However, if I start with an understanding that some people may just be currently committed to the wrong life principle then I can go about in a more constructive way to help reshape their thinking and beliefs to better match that of the Bible. One first step to move our people from where they are to where they need to go spiritually is to teach and empower them to begin the process of becoming committed to faithful biblical giving. One of the easiest ways that many leaders have found in doing this well is through the idea of a 90 Day Tithe Challenge. Ask non-givers either one-on-one or corporately to take up the challenge to faithfully tithe to the Lord as the Bible defines for the next 90 days. The more sincere and transparent that you can be with your people when extending the challenge for the 90 Day Tithe Challenge the more likely people will be willing to respond to your spiritual plea. During this process it would be good to remind people of the promises of God and how His word declares that if we as believers are faithful to Him in the various areas of our lives then He blesses our lives and actively works in and through our lives in incredible ways. God works in and through our faithfulness as believers. I would encourage you to report back to your congregation as a whole on how God has worked in the lives of those in the church that have participated in the 90 Day Tithe Challenge. When you share stories of faithfulness and God working in people's lives because of their faithfulness then it will become a natural gateway for other to take a step of faith in their giving as well.

INCREASE THE NUMBER OF REOCCURRING GIVERS

Has anyone ever said to you, "I meant to give this past weekend but I just forgot." They could have left their wallet in the car, the checkbook at home, or even in the moment could not find a pen to fill out the envelope. No matter the case the odds are that they will not catch up on their giving the following week. A few select people will but by in large you can count that "I forgot but will give next week" as "I will work hard and try to remember to at least give my offering next time." Don't be fooled into thinking that a majority of the people that forget

to give on any particular week are going to do what is needed to make that up, even if the church budget is counting on those contributions.



However, one thing that you can do to help things out is by encouraging more people to set their giving to a scheduled electronic reoccurring gift. A majority of people already know what their pay checks will

be each week, which means that their offering is probably consistently the same from week to week. A large majority people already receive their paychecks by direct deposit and pay many of their bills via online payments. I know in our house almost all of our bills are paid out each month via the internet and if we could figure out a way to electronically pay the remaining few we would pay those electronically as well. Giving to the church through an electronic reoccurring giving practice will not only help modern believers to remain faithful in giving God the first fruits of their labor as Scripture instructs but it will also enable the church and you as its leader to be a little bit less stressed about its finances. As I continue to say, I believe God's people want to support the work of the ministry. We just need to find ways to help encourage and empower them to be able to do that.

- THE LEAD PASTOR FACTOR - A MULTI-SITE CHURCH THOUGHT

This one is specifically for those countless multi-site churches that dot the map of our world. I have a soft spot for those guys since I served on staff of a great multi-site church for a long time. Let me get straight to the point. Have the lead pastor speak at the multi-site campus who is struggling. That's it. Because of the uniqueness that multi-site environments create the lead pastor will be able to step into the situation at a campus and challenge people to give and help make up the difference in ways that the campus pastor just cannot. Yes, you certainly want to have the campus pastor present and maybe even have him speaking alongside of the lead pastor but the lead pastor is the game changer.

Usually in these settings you would want to communicate primarily via vision casting and emphasizing God's work through the churches ministry and mission. A strong emphasis on the authority of God's word and our faithfulness to it can be communicated personally by the lead pastor at a level that the campus pastor cannot reach because of his placement in the church. This does not diminish the role of a campus pastor. This just takes into account the fact that the people within the church often view the lead pastor and a campus pastor on different levels, most of the time, and therefore respond to them with appropriate responses.

In addition the lead pastor will be able to speak with authority about how low individual and corporate giving at the campus is negatively impacting the church as a whole and how if not corrected will eventually hinder lives being transformed by the good news of Jesus. As a side note, a very much positive aspect of being a campus of a multisite church is that if you happen to be leading a campus where the giving is sluggish the rest of the church as a whole can financially prop up your campus while you seek to right the ship concerning the campuses unhealthy giving habits. As a campus pastor never hesitate to ask your lead pastor for help or coaching on how to deal with sensitive issues like low giving.

CREATE A SPECIAL PRAYER EMPHASIS WITH THE LEADERS OF YOUR SMALL GROUPS

I am often amazed at how things are impacted in the local church when small group leaders bind together and commit to pray about a specific topic or issue. For most churches the Sunday School or small group structure is the heart and soul of the church. And for most churches their most committed, Jesus minded, mission focused individuals are the ones who lead those small weekly gatherings of people. So it only makes sense that if you are facing a spiritual battle within your church that you would call on those that are most committed to help you fight that battle. When giving is low and people are being non-responsive that, my friend, is a spiritual battle. It is a matter of discipleship. It is a matter that needs much prayer. Why wouldn't you want your Sunday School or small group leaders praying

with you about something related to the spiritual health of the church. Amazing things happen when God's people pray.

Let me give you a sneak peek into what could begin to happen if you bring your group leaders on board in the area of praying about an important situation like this. First, they will be honored that you as their pastor would trust them with such a task. This will, in return, create a deeper sense of loyalty from them to you as their pastor and spiritual leader. Then they will begin to pray and think, "My whole small group should be praying about this important issue in our church." And so they will tell their small group to pray and in the midst of their small group praying there will be a person that attends that group that will hear God speaking to them about their giving practices and how it needs to be better, more in line with His teaching. They will respond to God's prompting and begin to give with more obedience. Which in return begins to help alleviate the problem of Christ followers not faithfully supporting the work of the ministry financially. If I were you I would get my most committed praying as soon as possible.

CELEBRATE, CELEBRATE, CELEBRATE

Most pastors I know work extremely hard leading their church to reach the world around them, literally doing everything they possibly can to see lives changed by the gospel of Jesus Christ. Unfortunately though, most of us are terrible at celebrating the victories that come up in our ministries. While I know that it is a challenge for most lead guys to pause for a moment and celebrate the truth is that we

need to learn to celebrate the life changes, bold steps of faith, milestones in recovery, faithful servers, sacrificial giving, and countless other things that people do that bring great honor and pleasure to our God. If Scripture teaches us that all of Heaven celebrates when someone comes to faith in Christ then don't you think we should learn to hit the pause button for a moment and celebrate as well?

I'm not just talking about standing up in a worship service and saying good job. That is certainly one way of celebrating but that is not the only way. People everywhere are the same; they have a tendency to do what gets celebrated the most. You want more people serving then celebrate those that have been faithfully serving. If you want more youth attending the youth service then celebrate the youth ministry and those that participate. You want more people tithing or sacrificially giving to the work of the ministry then celebrate those that have been faithfully tithing and those that have been giving sacrificially to help make things happen.


Give the people an example to follow. Teach them what God's Word says about giving and then show a variety of people from within the church and from outside of your local church that are doing it right. Tell them stories about different people that are living out God's Word in the area of giving and how it is making a difference in the church and outside of the church. Allow people to see video testimonies of people sharing how God has worked in their lives as a result of their faithfulness to Him in the area of giving and stewardship. God loves to bless those that honor him with faithfulness and obedience. What you celebrate within your church as a leader is what a majority of your people will begin doing. People love to be celebrated. They love to be bragged on. They love for someone to come alongside of them and say good job.

IN CLOSING!?!

As we wrap this up let me encourage you to start where I am ending. PRAY! Before you ask anyone else to pray or before you script out a master plan to get things back on track financially just stop and pray. Remembering that the God who created everything and who still to this day is holding it all together is ultimately the one in control. I guarantee you that He wants to talk in detail about the financial giving of your church. It does not matter how good or not so good it is He wants to talk. So, I say for the last time let your first step be you, as the leader, praying.

My prayer for you is that God blesses your steps tremendously as you approach the topics of tithing, giving, stewardship, and generosity within your local church.

So I called the priests and took an oath from them that they would do according to this promise.
